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The North Island Festival of Performing Arts is put on by a non-profit Society run by a volunteer Board. Our goal is to provide a Festival that is a fun, educational and friendly competition. At our NIFPA Dance Festival we strive to provide an opportunity for dance performers of all ages and levels to express their creativity, display their talents and expand their knowledge, skill and self-confidence. We ask all participating individuals, including participants, teachers, parents and volunteers, in our Festival, to respect, support and be kind to one another.

Please be sure to read the all of the rules. It is the responsibility of the studios to comply with all Festival rules and regulations and registration in the Festival is an acknowledgement by the studios to comply with these rules.

General Information

Competitors

- All competitors will enter through the lower parking lot in the back of the building.
- Please do not arrive more than 1 (one) hour before your scheduled session time.
- Competitors will check in with the NIFPA volunteer at the door and proceed to their assigned dressing room.
- We ask that competitors not attend if having symptoms of illness.

Dance Studios

- Studios must have a studio representative at the theatre if any of their competitors are at the theatre.
- Children under 12 may not be left unsupervised in the Green room and dressing rooms.
- Please enter through the lower parking lot in the back of the building.
- Check in with the NIFPA volunteer at the door; you will receive a lanyard to be worn in the theatre during festival days. Please wear your lanyard as this allows NIFPA volunteers and Theatre staff to know you are a studio representative.
- Green room and dressing room access begins 1 (one) hour before the start of each session.
- Studios will receive marks via email at the end of each day.
- At the end of festival, studios will receive a password to share with their dancers for access to adjudication videos.

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Green Room and Dressing Rooms

- No parents are allowed in the backstage/dressing room areas of the theatre.
- Please do not use the public washrooms for hair and makeup, please use the dressing rooms.
- There will be a designated area of the Green room for warmup.
- Studios will be pre-assigned an area in dressing rooms for their dancers.

Theatre

- Admission to watch festival sessions will by donation via TipTap pay system. NIFPA relies on donations to cover festival costs and appreciates all donations.
- Participant dancers in festival are not required to pay admission.
- Admission to theatre seating will commence 15 minutes prior to the start of sessions
- Cell phones, pagers, watches must be silenced in the theatre. Please dim the brightness also to avoid distraction of the performers.
- No food or drinks (except water) are allowed in the theatre
- Please remember this is an adjudicated performance. Please refrain from calling out or whistling; use clapping to show appreciation after the performance. Noise from the audience can be picked up by the adjudication microphones. The exception to this rule is for the Hip Hop sessions where we encourage all to support the performers on stage.

Stage

- Stage flooring for dance at the theatre is Rosco Adagio; dimensions 26' 3" x 26' 3".
- Dancers may warm up on stage prior to each session. No rehearsals on stage once the festival begins.
- Dance studios are not permitted to mark the stage for any dance number. Stage
 marking will be done by the theatre technician (back-left, centre, right; centre stage;
 front-left, centre, right).

Lost, Stolen, Damaged Property and Injury

The North Island Festival of Performing Arts Society (the 'Society') is not responsible
for any claims, demands or damage to musical instruments, props or any other
personal property. The Society's acceptance of a competitor's application for entry
into the North Island festival will release any responsibility of the Society or volunteers
of the Society from claims, demands, damages, actions or causes or action arising out

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of our in consequence of any loss, injury or damage to any competitor or any competitors personal property incurred whiled attending or participating in the North Island Festival. This clause shall also apply to all member of the public attending any and all events.

- Please do not leave valuables unattended anywhere.
- Please report any lost or stolen items to the NIFPA volunteers or the Theatre staff.

Rules and Regulations

- The NIFPA Board of Directors reserves the right to alter the time for any competition if special circumstances warrant, and due notification of such change being given and reserves the right to cancel any of the arrangements detailed in the Rules or Program as it deems necessary.
- NIFPA reserves the right to split or combine categories or age groups according to the number of entries. If any class has 10 or more entries, the class will be split according to age. Split classes will be adjudicated separately.

Photography and Video

- Registration in NIFPA festival is an acknowledgement and agreement that the studios have parent/guardian authorization for entry into North Island Festival of Performing Arts. By registering in NIFPA, participant(s) acknowledge and agree that they are giving consent that photographs, taken by a person acting on behalf of the Society, of participants/students/dancers may be used by the Society for promotional and fundraising purposes, may be released to the media and remain the property of the Society.
- No videos, photography or tape recording is allowed during sessions.
- Photography is permitted during adjudications between sessions and during awards.

Complaints and Protests

- Complaints or protests must be made in writing to the North Island Festival of Performing Arts Board and accompanied by a protest fee of \$20.00. A committee will be formed of three members of the Festival Board, whose decision will be final. The protest fee will be returned should the protest be sustained.

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Boundaries

The boundaries for the North Island Festival of Performing Arts are:

- S.D. 47 Powell River

- S.D. 72 Campbell River
- S.D. 84 Vancouver Island West

- To qualify for NIFPA Awards or to be eligible for Provincial Recommendations participants must be entered under a studio within these boundaries.
- All entries to NIFPA must be under a performing arts organization/business or educational institution with a business licence and adequate insurance coverage.
 Independent entries into NIFPA are not permitted; please speak with your studio for information.

Registration

Registration

- All competitions are open to amateurs only. The term "amateur" shall mean one who is studying under a qualified teacher and whose principal income is not derived from services or from solo performances in the particular category in which one is competing.
- Registration is based on ages as of December 31 of the year preceding Festival.
- Registration will be open from November 1 and close November 15 at 10pm.
- Registration is online via: https://nifpa.signup.dance/. The link for registration will be on the nifpa.org homepage.
- Studios, please see the Guideline for Registration (Appendix A) for further technical details on how to register.
- All music must be submitted via the online registration system no later than January 15th.
- All registered selections must have title at registration and cannot be registered as TBA.

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A dance routine can be performed only once in a competition during the festival. A
routine can be repeated from a previous year provided it is presented by a different
person or persons.

Divisions

- Solos, Duets and Trios: Age is as of December 31 of the year preceding Festival. All dancers must be within the age limit of the class. The age of the oldest dancer will determine the age category.
- Small (4-7 dancers) and Large (8+ dancers) Groups: Age is as of December 31 of the year preceding Festival. The ages of the dancers will be averaged to determine the age category. No dancer can be more than 2 (two) years older than the age category group. Please contact NIFPA by email if the age of your oldest dancer is more than the 2 years allowed.

Registration Fees

- Payment for registration is completed through the online registration system via <u>STRIPE.com</u> and is necessary to complete registration. All credit cards are accepted.
- No refunds are permissible, except for accident or illness. Requests for refunds are to be in writing (emails are accepted) and accompanied by an explanation of withdrawal.
- · Please notify NIFPA asap with any withdrawals.

Competition

Music, Choreography and Costumes

- Studios/teachers should ensure that the music lyrics, movement, and costumes are age appropriate and not provocative or offensive. All entries must be appropriate for a family audience, regardless of the age of the performer.
- Costume definition includes accessories shoe, hat, glove, corset, handkerchief, fan, umbrella, cane, and jewellery.

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- Prop definition includes any object placed on the stage that gives the performance specific period, place or character including but not limited to set pieces such as chairs, stairs, boxes, etc. Smaller objects are referred to as "hand props".
- Instrumental or percussive use of voice is to be considered as music.
- No more than two acrobatic tricks where the hips pass over the head are allowed in all
 disciplines, excluding Acro and Hip Hop. (Back and front walk-overs, flips, tumbling
 passes, etc.) Acceptable movement not counted as acrobatic tricks are handstands,
 cartwheels, front/back rolls, dolphin rolls, and technical movements within the
 discipline.
- Lip synchronization is permitted in Modern Stage and Hip Hop only.

Re-dances (New)

- Re-dances for technical difficulties will not be penalized.
- If a competitor who is under 12 (11 or under) leaves the stage prior to their performance being completed, they may re-dance without penalty.
- If a competitor 12 years or older leaves the stage prior to their performance being completed, they may re-dance with a 5 mark deduction.

Time Limits

- Performances will be timed from the beginning of the performance to the end.
- Presets/bows will not be timed.
- The following time limits will be strictly enforced. Overtime performances will be adjudication only.
- Solos: 3 minutes maximum
- Groups: 6 minutes maximum
- Song & Dance Solos: 4 minutes maximum
- Production Groups (Song & Dance and Hip Hop): 12 minutes maximum

Adjudication

- Two adjudicators will provide a video adjudication for each performance.
- Each performance will receive a percentage mark, unless the entry is for adjudication only.
- All marks are confidential, and will be provided to the studios at the end of each day.
- The Adjudicator's decision will be final; the Discipline Specialist will have the final say within their discipline.

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- Communication with the adjudicator throughout the festival is not allowed. It is, however, understood that necessary training and discussion may take place between the performer and adjudicator during adjudications or workshops. A friendly 'hello' or 'compliment of service' is always welcome.
- If an adjudicator decides that an entry is in the wrong class, the performance will receive 'adjudication only' in the class the adjudicator deems is correct.
- Adjudicators will talk to the dancers after each session and will present placements and standings.
- The entire adjudication is to be treated as a performance and attendance by dancers is expected.

Adjudicator Workshops

- Adjudicator workshops will be scheduled for each discipline and will be open to all festival participants once registration is complete and if space warrants.
- Attendance is mandatory for provincial representative eligibility. Written feedback
 from adjudicators will not be provided, however, participation, technique, and ability
 will be considered by the adjudicator for provincial recommendations.
- Studios must email info.nifpa@gmail.com by November 15th with a list of provincial rep contenders with the dancer's name, discipline and age. Those dancers will be registered in the appropriate workshop. Payment for the workshop is the responsibility of the dancer and is paid directly to NIFPA via etransfer to finance.nifpa@gmail.com.
- Where space warrants, the workshops will be opened up to all other festival registrants. Registration will be done via email to NIFPA by the dancers and paid for via etransfer prior to the start of Festival.
- Workshop fee: \$35 per workshop

Scoring and Placements

- All placements and standings will be announced onstage.
- For a competitor to receive a Placement of First, Second or Third, they must obtain a mark of at least 80%.
- Ties for 1st place are not permitted.
- 1st place must receive a mark of 85% or higher.
- Solos, Duets and Trios will receive medals for placement.
- Groups will receive a wristband for each dancer for placement. Studio reps may collect wristbands in the lobby and distribute.

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Standings Levels:

95% and over: Diamond 90% - 94.99%: Platinum

85% - 89.99%: Gold 80% - 84.99%: Silver 75% - 79.99%: Bronze

Provincial Recommendations

- To be eligible, a dancer must have participated with 2 (two) contrasting solo classes in the dance discipline for which they are being recommended (ballet, stage or modern); attend the appropriate adjudicator's workshop; study within our boundaries; and achieve an 85% on each recommended entry.
- Registration in adjudicator workshops for provincial eligibility must be completed no later than November 15th by email to info.nifpa@gmail.com by studios. No late entries will be accepted.
- All solos within a discipline will be averaged to obtain eligibility mark.
- Provincial eligibility for stage requires either a jazz or lyrical jazz solo and one from another stage category (tap, song & dance, modern stage or acro).
- Provincial eligibility for modern solos must be contrasting in style.
- Any competitor receiving a Provincial nomination from another Festival is ineligible for a nomination to the PABC Provincial Festival from NIFPA whether the offer has been accepted or not.

Awards and Concerts

- As per each discipline's requirement of 2 solos, awards may be given to encourage and assist entrants in their pursuit of artistic studies. The number of awards will depend on the amount of money in the award fund.
- Wrap Up Shows: Any entrant may be chosen to perform at the Dance Gala and must be prepared to appear if requested. All Provincial Reps will be invited to perform in the Provincial Showcase (if held). All Reps, Alternates and Merited Participants will be acknowledged at the Provincial Showcase (if held). More information will be provided closer to the event time.
- Registration to Provincials for all Representatives will be paid for by NIFPA. If funds are available, additional money may be awarded to reps to assist with travel costs.

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Categories

• In most disciplines, the rules for soloists are written with provincial eligibility in mind, to avoid disqualifications at that level. Therefore, we have tried to note where groups are given more leeway to allow exploration and expressions of choreography.

BALLET CLASSES

Classical Ballet — All Age Groups - No props. This category is for all classical ballet - soft shoe **or** En Pointe. No vocals allowed in music for solos. Group entries may use music with vocals. If numbers are sufficient, demi and pointe will be separated.

Ballet Repertoire Variation — All Age Groups - No props. Soft shoe **or** En Pointe. No vocals allowed in music. If numbers are sufficient, demi and pointe will be separated.

Open Ballet — All Age Groups - No props. Ballet combined with other dance elements and components pushing its limitations. This class replaces previous year's interpretive, contemporary, and lyrical ballet classes. Soft shoe **or** En Pointe. No vocals allowed in music for solos. Group numbers may use music with vocals and are not required to wear shoes. If numbers are sufficient, demi and pointe will be separated.

Demi-Character — All Age Groups - Props show characterization of story. Dancer must perform ballet technique from the waist down and the character from the waist up. Clear characterization must be present in choreography. Costume and title is **not** enough to qualify a routine as Demi Character. Props can be used as an integral part of the characterization or story. Soft shoe **or** En Pointe. No vocals allowed in music for solos (contemporary ballet solos may have lyrics). Group numbers may use music with vocals. If numbers are sufficient, demi and pointe will be separated.

National — All Age Groups - A routine of national origin, authentic in the style and costume of any country (ie: Ukrainian, Polynesian, Southest Asian, Spanish, Russian, First Nations etc.). No set competitive dance.

MODERN CLASSES

Provincial Eligibility requires 2 CONTRASTING solos.

Modern-Contemporary — All Age Groups. Free movement of dance encompassing various dance disciplines with modern technique as its underlying base a constantly evolving style of movement that gives physicality to human ideologies and concepts with emphasis on engaging the whole body. Vocals allowed in music.

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Modern-Interpretive — All Age Groups. Dance that uses a recognized modern technique to tell a story, express a feeling, interpret a character, behaviour, or emotional state. Movement should be related to the intent of the music. Vocals allowed in music.

HIP HOP

All Age Groups - minimum use of props.

A constantly evolving form of dance that relies on individualism and personal style and emphasizes the expressive power of movement - should include but not be limited to choreography that incorporates a blend of contemporary funk and street style with jazz techniques. May include moves such as gliding, popping, locking, waving and utilize house, old-school and new school. May also include gymnastics, power moves or any series of tricks or stunts. No reference to violence or derogatory sexual content or language is permitted or deductions will be made.

STAGE CLASSES

Provincial eligibility requires 2 solos; one solo in jazz or lyrical and one from another category.

Jazz — All Age Groups. Use of isolated movements, combined with recognized jazz technique showing strong sense of rhythm and coordination. Must be pure dance. No more than two acrobatic tricks are permitted in this category.

Lyrical — All Age Groups. A dance that is generally performed to music in slower tempos and interprets the lyrics or intent of that piece of music. This genre uses a soft jazz-based technique with facial and body emotion to portray an idea, story, or mood.

Acro — All Age Groups. Free movement, improvised and usually characterized by syncopated rhythm and us of isolated movements and acrobatic tricks.

Tap — All Age Groups. Entries will be adjudicated on foot work, rhythm, style and presentation. No interpretation of a story line. No tap sounds in music.

Modern Stage — All Age Groups. Live voice not permitted; lip synchronization is permitted. Dance must be suited to stage or music production. Routine must be entertaining and diversified (no straight-line work) with a character base to it.

Song and Dance — All Age Groups. Minimum use of props. A routine suited to stage production. Equal effort in dancing, singing, and acting will be an integral part of the overall performance. Routine must comprise **voice** and **dance** and will be adjudicated on both.

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ALL DANCE DISCIPLINES

Young Choreographers — Age Groups 11+ - Props depending on class

This category will be divided by the number of performers (not choreographers) but will be placed in the Choreographer's age grouping as defined in all other classes. For example: a 13 year old choreographer sets a piece on 3 performers with the oldest being 10; the piece will be placed in the Young Choreographer - Trio, 14 and under group.

Further Direction for Young Choreographer:

Student chooses own music, theme, and style (discipline-must be noted); and has the option to perform their own piece or set it onto another dancer(s). Performers must be listed on entry. Comprehensive notes must be submitted for the adjudicator to review. Choreographers should think of the following when creating and include as much of the process as possible in their notes.

- Theme/story
- Use of space. Levels (highs, lows, close, far)
- Relationships within a piece. Dancer/music or in group pieces with one another.
- Staging/Movement. Visual impact positions onstage.
- · Costume(s).
- Discipline. Breakdown the routine in counts and/or steps in written form. Use technical terms as appropriate. Also, may use recorded video but this must include the above not just a run through of the dance.
- Choreographer Bio. (not required but is an added touch).
- End Result. Someone could take these notes or video and use to set piece upon dancer(s).

Teachers/Studios, please encourage your young choreographers with:

- Use of studio to practice.
- Mentoring helping with structure of creative process/choreography.
- Correction of technique to ensure safety and health of dancer(s).

Student must submit written/video choreography to the NIFPA Board by February 1st prior to Festival via email info.nifpa@gmail.com.

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Appendix A

Studio Guidelines for Registration

Registration opens November 1st and ends November 15th at 10 p.m.

The registration system is DanceSync hosted by TMMDance. Below are some tips to help with registering.

- The link for online registration is https://nifpa.signup.dance/. It will be posted on the nifpa.org homepage
- You will need to set up an account of your studio or login with your previous account login and password. Make sure you select the correct competition and year.
- Teachers/Studios to prepare and make registration easier you can create a worksheet listing all your students; first and last name, (these can be in separate or same column), birthdate, and gender. This document must be saved as a CSV (comma separated value) file. Then you will upload it to your account and it will be the last time you enter student data. Note: this information may be added with each entry as well.
- You will need the **Title** for each selection as these are what separates each entry. Titles can be edited later but you will need to have one; TBA is not permitted.
- You will need the time/length of each piece this can be a guesstimate and is for ensuring we program enough time.
- You will need the **choreographer** for each entry.
- You will select a discipline and class for each entry.
- You will need to designate if the entry starts the dance Onstage; Offstage Right;
 Offstage Left; or both.
- You will need to select if an entry is Non-competitive and note whether you want them
 to be separated in the program in the note field. Please followup with an email to
 info.nifpa@gmail.com.
- If prompted, you will need to select **En Pointe** and/or **Provincial Rep** if either of those apply. (Please note: Studios must also email info.nifpa@gmail.com with their Provincial rep lists by November 15th.)
- Students can then be connected to the entry from the list of students inputed previously. The student list can be manipulated by age of kids to aid in finding students in a large list.
- Payment will be collected using STRIPE.com. Payment is necessary to complete registration. All credit cards are accepted.

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
